Outreach

I was able to get in touch with my brother recently concerning his salvation. I have been praying for many years for his salvation. When we were in Ontario he gave testimony of how they left the Old Colony Mennonite Church; seeing the falsehood in a works based salvation. Although he spoke of their leaving and the truth about salvation being by grace through faith, he left me on the edge of my seat never testifying that he had personally done that which he was speaking about. After this I tried to get together with him to ask him where he stood, but it never worked out. I was so burdened that I finally text him to see where he stood. You have to understand that it takes years for an open door with Mennonites, and especially family. It took 5 years for an open door to share the Gospel with him (with many attempts prior to that), and 11 years to get to this point. There were walls that had to come down, a trust to build, and a patient and tender approach to be made. In the text I asked him if there was a point in his life that he had been saved, trusting in Jesus Christ as his Saviour? I told him "I was thinking back to when I got saved and wondered where I would be if I never had the chance to express it [salvation]. I did not say anything until a week later when my co-worker asked me if I was saved and I said yes. I needed that because who knows how long until I would have expressed it. I pray for the entire family every day to be saved but sometimes wonder if some are and have not expressed it or have expressed it as best as they know how, when from my perspective I want to hear a clear "I got saved" or a testimony". To this he replied "Hey John. I don't express it like some people, but yes, I have accepted Jesus to be my Saviour". This was exciting news and I want to hear his testimony. I am looking at going through a discipleship course with him. Please pray for wisdom in working with him.

Recently we have had to find "different" ways to share the Gospel with people. One good way I have found is to order pizza for delivery. This reminded me of the days I lived in Yellowknife, NT. I would use the taxi for transit and would work with one company until I met all the drivers and shared the Gospel with them and then move on to the next company. Right now for the pizza delivery its Dominos. The spirit has been good. It is unique to see people calm down and open up in the midst of all the hustle and bustle of life, especially pizza delivery folk who seem to be more like street racers at times. One of the delivery ladies I was able to give a tract to, said that her children attended the Master Club program on Wednesday nights at Pembina Valley Baptist Church. Pray that she too would start to come out for the Wednesday night services.

<u>Virtual</u>

This is a term used a lot in recent months. Our family was moving forward and able to reach 30% of our needed support in 11 months of deputation when everything came to a sudden stop in mid March. Since then, every meeting has been cancelled, with meetings into November 2020.
